This fall has been full of special events, tours, and hands-on history in action, offering residents and visitors alike the chance to explore Matthews' rich past.

October began with a headstone cleaning event at Historic Matthews Cemetery, held in partnership with the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Historic Landmarks Commission and Christ Covenant Church. We're grateful to everyone who joined us in helping preserve this important piece of Matthews history. More than 70 volunteers came out on a Saturday morning and cleaned over 200 headstones in just two hours. Following the cleanup, Michael Meath led a tour of the cemetery. It was a wonderful day of service, learning, and community connection.

We were also thrilled to welcome twelve 6th grade classes from Crestdale Middle School for walking tours of the Matthews Heritage Trail and visits to the Matthews Heritage Museum. This marks our first year partnering with Crestdale Middle, and the response has been overwhelmingly positive. After speaking with the school's principal, we're happy to share that this program will continue next year—giving future students the opportunity to explore the local history tied to their school's namesake.

To round out a busy season, the Museum hosted a private walking tour for the Carolina Women's Club of Charlotte. We explored historic buildings, learned about former sites that helped shape Matthews' early years, and enjoyed a stop at the Historic Reid House. It was a wonderful morning of discovery and conversation with an engaged and enthusiastic group.
